Becoming a Young Enterprise Scotland volunteer will challenge and reward you. The excitement and satisfaction of mentoring, of transforming attitudes and helping young people open their eyes to the world of enterprise keeps many of our volunteers coming back year after year. You use your business experience to help students set up and run a successful business over an academic year. This involves mentoring, facilitation, instilling business acumen and encouraging them to overcome and learn from various challenges and setbacks. You work closely with one of teaching staff and sometimes other volunteers. This role requires an enhanced PVG check and Online Child Protection training.

The company teams are “learning by doing” - they benefit from the continuity of your experience and guidance in working as a team, solving business problems, communication, planning, etc. It is their business, your role is to guide, advise, mentor and encourage them to reflect upon their learning and transfer newly-developed skills into new situations. You would be making a real contribution to helping young people achieve their potential. The experience of helping a young company develop and grow over several months, encountering and tackling a variety of real business issues, can be very rewarding indeed.

These programmes run over an academic year, from Aug/Sept through to the end of the spring term, sometimes beyond. Teams that progress in the various competition elements can continue into June/July.
